Key Stage 1 News Year 1

In Literacy this week we have received a picture of Alice in wonderland. We have used our wonderful imaginations to write a huge word bank of adjectives and nouns to help us write a setting description. We spent a considerable amount of time planning our ideas before working hard on our beautiful handwriting! Later in the week we spent lots of time looking at using capital letters for names, people, places, months and days. We completed a list of proper nouns and common nouns.

In Math's this week we have completed lots of work on division. We have worked hard to share equally and focus on labelling equal groups. The children can now identify a quantity and share it equally amongst a range of groups. We are excited to start our new topic next week all about length!

In Computing this week we have continued looking at tools on paint. We have discussed their function and explored together how to save a file. The children were amazing at identifying lots of different tools!

In Geography this week we have revisited our knowledge on countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom. We have used an atlas to look at the surrounding seas and will work independently to label these on a map next week!

On Friday we completed some retrieval activities in science, history and geography and the children amazed me with what they can remember!

Year 2

This week Year 2 have been working really hard to develop confidence and independence.

In Maths, we have focused on Fractions. We have identified fractions and were able to shade the correct part of a shape. We started to compare the sizes of different fractions using our more than, less than and equal to symbols. We found out that two quarters is the same as a half!

In Writing this week we wrote our newspaper report including all of the correct features. We ensured that we wrote in columns and also edited our work afterwards to see if we could make any

improvements. Later on in the week we looked at homophones and what they are. We enjoyed identifying homophones and we even remember how to spell different words as we have learnt these in our spelling time!

In RE we looked at the Islamic Pilgrimage and retold their journey by drawing pictures and labelling the different places they visited. We retrieved information about the five pillars and this helped us with our learning and understanding of the subject.

In Science, we discussed the different seasons of the year and matched them to the correct months of the year. We then took part in an investigation to collect data relating to how much sunlight is in each day. We used the data collected to create a graph and plotted our data onto the graph.

In Computing, we used J2 data again but this time we created our very own pictogram using data that we had collected. This was fun!

During PSHE, we used my happy breathing techniques to help Team HAP work effectively. We revised what the team do and how they help our brains. We talked about what would happen if Team HAP didn't work together and how this would make us feel. **Miss Kerrigan**

Key Stage 2 News

Year 3

In English this week, we have been focusing on imperative verbs and how they are used to write instructions. Shortly, we will be writing a set of instructions on how to make a healthy sandwich.

In Maths we have begun looking at adding and subtractions with the same denominator. The children are doing exceptionally well and have remembered the rule... when you are adding/subtracting fractions with the same denominator, the denominator doesn't change! In science, we labelled the parts of a plant and looked at each of their functions.

In R.E, the children looked into Sikh festivals and learned why certain festivals are celebrated in their culture.

For computing, we had a little lesson exploring the software 'Scratch' where the children get to input algorithms into the laptops and it moves their little sprite! We also began looking at how data can be collected and even created our own branching databases relating to dinosaurs.

For geography, we looked at a blank map of England and used the iPads to find all of England's regions. The children then made sure their map was labelled correctly. Mrs Hogan

Year 4

This week has been a very exciting week in Year 4.

We started our week by having a meeting with Lord Norton of Louth for a 'Live at the Lords' session. We found out about what they do at the House of Lords and what it was like working as a Lord. We asked him about how long he has been a Lord, what he does for his career as well as what laws he has been involved in making.

In English, we have arrived on the very fateful day of the 24th August 79AD. We have started the week by thinking about Tranio's day and using the present perfect to help to describe what had

happened so far that day. We then created timelines of his day and not only thought about what he had done but how he was feeling when it was happening and what sights, smells and sounds he may have experienced. We ended the week by writing diary entries as Tranio about the events so far.

In Maths, we have been moving on to equivalent fractions. We started the week by looking practically using fraction strips and looking at what equivalent fractions we could make. We then moved on to looking at them on a number line so that we could see our wholes were the same size but we could have different size pieces that could equal the same size. We ended the week by looking at how we can use multiplication and division to help us to work out equivalent fractions.

In Computing, we have been looking at the internet and networks. We thought about how the internet is a giant network. We turned our classroom in to a big network first for just one place and then multiple networks. We sent our messages to the switches and they delivered the messages across the room.

In Geography, we have been ending our learning for the year by comparing the Northwest with the Attica region in Greece which is where Athens is situated. We have been collecting information on both human and physical geographical features and then thinking about how they compare.

Year 4 also spent a fantastic outdoor day on Tuesday, as well as PE they had a fantastic forest school session where they learnt why ropes and tarpaulins are so important when camping. **Mrs Shone**

Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have been looking at a range of geometry topics. First, we looked at angles around a point and found missing angles by adding them up to make 360 degrees. We then looked at regular and irregular polygons and identified the differences. Finally, we revised using co-ordinates and progressed onto co-ordinates in 4 quadrants.

In writing, we looked at adverbs of possibility and created sentences about the book Holes using these. We also revised using subordinate clause starters and created sentences with the correct punctuation.

In geography, we looked at the pros and cons of importing food. We discussed how importation supports jobs and allowing people to try a variety of foods form around the world. However, we talked about the problems associated with the transportation e.g. the release of CO2 and poor conditions the workers have to deal with.

In Design Technology, we looked at different bread types and their ingredients. We researched nutritional value of bread currently being sold in the supermarkets and learnt all about the traffic light system.

Finally, we looked at the life cycle of a star. We learnt how the star starts as dust and gas before pulling together and shining brightly. We acted out the different stages of a stars life to help us to remember this.
