### Early Years News

#### Nursery

This week we have been learning about nocturnal animals and we have looked more closely at facts about hedgehogs. The children have really enjoyed creating their own print collage hedgehogs and have been using a range of resources to add the prickles to playdough hedgehogs.

We also had lots of fun on World Languages Day on Tuesday when we transported ourselves to France. We made our own French flags, found out about and tasted some different French food, learnt about the Eiffel Tower and used art straws to create our own. We also learnt how to say hello in French as well as how to count to 5.

The children have been absolutely amazing when sharing the wonderful objects, photographs and memories that they have been bringing back in their special boxes. It has been an absolute pleasure to witness the pride of each child as they have stood in front of the group and talked about each item in detail. We will continue to share boxes for those children who have not yet done so and for any child who would still like to return their special box to nursery with some little treasures, we will carry this over to next week if needed.

#### Reception

This week we have continued to learn more Set 1 sounds in phonics, and have also used our knowledge of these sounds to sort them into hoops. The children have been using paintbrushes in flour to write letters using the correct letter formation. I just want to say that I have also been pleasantly surprised to see some children sounding out and blending simple CVC words already at this point in the year.

In Maths, the children have been continuing to focus on counting with 1:1 correspondence and we have also been using our knowledge of number to subitise numbers 1-3. The children have been matching numerals to a wide variety of spots in varying positions. We celebrated European Day of Languages this week!

The children had the opportunity to learn all about Italy; including how to say hello in Italian and we looked at where Italy is located on Google Earth view. The children loved making the tower of Pisa using pasta shapes, and they also got the chance to try out some tasty Italian cuisine in the afternoon.

### Key Stage 1 News

#### Year 1

We have had a very busy week in Year 1 and the children have made great progress. The Naughty Bus has disappeared from our classroom and we have been discussing where we think he may have gone! When we arrived at school on Wednesday Miss Lewis told us she had received an important letter from the office with a range of pictures attached. We were

amazed to see the Naughty Bus had visited London and had even zoomed past Big Ben! We have completed some lovely writing this week looking at adjectives to describe pictures.

We have worked hard as a class this week to focus on our independence and remember where we sit in different lessons. The children have gained so much confidence and it is wonderful to see them so eager to work at their desk. We are working on our concentration and using resources around us to support our independent learning.

In Maths this week we have completed some extra work on finding more and less than a given number and discussed subtraction when finding less and addition when finding more. We moved onto comparing sets of objects using key vocabulary before being introduced to 3 symbols; greater than, less than and equals. Although we found this tricky, the children persevered to complete their work and were so proud of themselves!

On Tuesday afternoon we had a wonderful forest school lesson and even spent some time around the fire in our outdoor classroom. The children completed a leaf identification task, explored the trees and enjoyed participating in teamwork activities. Year 1 were so sensible when reading a story around the fire and expressed how calm this made them feel before home time. In Science this week we have continued learning all about our senses. We wrote a list of 5 things we hear, smell, taste, touch and see.

Our topic in Computing is 'Computer Skills', therefore we have spent some more time on the laptops this week. We have independently switched them on, tried hard to type the password and independently used the trackpad. We found it tricky to use the trackpad, however enjoyed using paint software to help develop our skills.

The children are now participating in our weekly singing assembly and Mrs Skelton has mentioned how well the children are participating. Well done Year 1! **Miss Lewis** 

#### Year 2

What a busy week we have had in Year 2! This week we have been recognising different two and three digit numbers and continued to represent these numbers with different manipulatives. We compared different numbers using our more than and less than symbols and began to look at number patterns. We can count in twos, fives and tens!

In writing this week we learnt what an adjective is and identified it in sentences. We then used our knowledge to describe a person and write the adjectives in sentences. Next week we will be writing in paragraphs including adjectives and conjunctions. In Music this week we continued to learn about duration and used different instruments to create long and short sounds. We loved singing in our music lesson!

On Tuesday it was European day of languages and we celebrated with lots of fun activities in class. We learnt how to say hello in five languages, we learnt how to say and recognise Spanish colours, label our bodies in Spanish and sang lots of Spanish songs!! It was a fun day!

In History this week we found some very interesting pictures in our classroom. We came to the conclusion that the pictures were from the past during the time of the Great Fire of London. We listened to what happened in 1666 and we can't wait to find out more next week!

#### Key Stage 2 News

#### Year 3

In English this week we have had a go at improving simple sentences by adding exciting adjectives to make them more complex! We also had another lesson on similes and the children created some fantastic new ones to go in their description! They are ready to write their description on Monday now!

In Maths, the children focused more on 1, 10 and 100 less than a 3-digit number and are now super confident! They then moved onto counting in 50's and have spent some time noticing the similarities and differences between the 50's and the 5 times tables.

The children have finished our shared reading book now which they all thoroughly enjoyed! They had some writing opportunities within the last week with our shared reading lessons as they used their summary skills to summarise the chapters and then they used their inference skills to infer how Tuffy was feeling about his trip to the vets!

In Geography, the children used atlases to locate Warrington on the map, and then they used their knowledge on 'keys' to create their own key based on the map they were looking at.

In History, the children focused on 'threats' and 'assets' of the stone age and had to identify whether different features such as 'mammoths' or 'weather' was a 'threat' or an 'asset' for their survival.

In Science, we investigated the properties of different rocks and looked at whether they were permeable or not, or if they had a high density. **Miss Conway** 

#### Year 4

This week, in Year 4 we started the week with Music Monday where we worked on learning about pentatonic scales and using ostinato patterns. In recorders, we have continued learning our first notes and playing our first song.

In Maths, we have been looking at 1, 10, 100 and 1000 more. We have been observing what columns we need to look at when adding different values, what happens when we add or subtract an amount that requires an exchange, and what effect it has on other columns. We have then looked at how we can work systematically in preparation for ordering and comparing numbers next week.

In English, we have completed our first big write of the year and have written instructions for creating a perfect hero. We had to think about using all the features that instructions have and remembering to include all the important aspects of spelling and grammar such as commas in a list, fronted adverbials, using adverbs of time and manner as well as making sure our -ly words are spelt correctly. We then have started to look at our next write which is a retell of the Hare and the Tortoise as our focus changes to myths, legends and fables. WE have looked at an example which we can improve.

In Geography, we have been taking our climate zones even smaller and looking at biomes. Biomes are areas of the planet with a similar climate and landscape, where similar animals and plants live. We have looked at the major biomes that exist in Europe such as deciduous forest, alpine and polar in preparation for writing our own factsheets.

On Tuesday it was European Day of Languages and in Year 4 we look at Welsh which is one of the oldest spoken European languages. The children had a great time learning how to say good morning, afternoon and evening as well as learning to count to 10. **Mrs Shone** 

#### Year 5

This week in year 5 we have continued our place value topic in Maths. Our focus has been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000. We will consolidate this next week.

In Writing, we started our preparations to write an informative text about the magical weapons and tools within our class shared read book "Podkin One-Ear". We researched ambitious vocabulary that we could include in our final pieces.

For our History topic, we built on our knowledge of the Anglo-Saxons and where they settled. We located the seven Anglo-Saxon kingdoms on a map of the UK and learnt that the word England came from the Anglo-Saxons "Angle-land".

In Geography, we used the VR headsets to bring our topic of North America to life! We visited places such as Times Square in New York, the Golden Gate Bridge, the Grand Canyon and the Rocky Mountains. We then categorised these features into physical and human geography depending on whether they are natural or manmade monuments.

Finally, in Spanish, we learnt how to say and write different school subjects. We found some similarities e.g. la historia and las matemáticas. We practised using some actions to help us to remember these!

#### Year 6

Year 6 have been working on the skills of clarification and summarising in whole class shared reading, analysing in depth our class novel, 'Boy'.

In Geography, we have begun to focus in on Brazil in our South America topic, where we have investigated the 6 major regions of Brazil which highlights the different biomes of Brazil and how diverse Brazil is.

In Computing, the children completed their combo line and bar graphs to show how diverse the climate is in Brazil.

The children looked closely at the grammatical features of biographies in preparation for completing their own biography on Charles Darwin. They looked at building sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions and also added subordinate clauses before and after main clauses in a sentence. They also added in relative clauses where relevant.

In RSE and PSHE, the children continued to learn about how they could deal better in situations where they may disagree with someone.

In Maths, the children have been adding and subtracting fractions, comparing and ordering fractions and have now moved onto multiplying fractions. **Mr Gould**
