School reply

- 1. Many thanks for your comment. Currently we communicate with parents in the following ways; School website, text messages, emails, school newsletter, twitter, podcasts, phone calls and Facebook (from September). School have already appointed someone who will work closely with parents and families. They will take up their post in September.
- 2. Thank you for your comments. All staff working with children have had training in neurodevelopment. We can't be specialists in this but do always look to external agencies to support us with meeting the needs of all children.
- 3. That's lovely to hear we are really pleased they enjoy coming to Bruche and have lots of friends!
- 4. Many thanks for your feedback. We will certainly look into how we use ParentPay moving forward. We always try to give parents as much notice about events at school but sometimes it's no possible due to other circumstances. It's really important that everyone reads the school newsletter each week as this is where we inform you of upcoming events like parents evening. For example On 4th February we sent the school newsletter home informing all parents that parents evening would be face to face and take place on week commencing 7th March.

Over the next couple of weeks we are going to do an audit of our MAT schools and schools in our local area on the kinds of information they send home about children's progress to see if there is anything else we can do to update you on your child's progress. If you have any ideas on the kind of information you would like sending home please let us know.

We plan to send out maths and English future learning though a package called
schoolonline. This will enable parents to see what their child will be doing in the
coming weeks and also support them in any pre teaching.
