

I really like fiction books especially those by Lee Child. I also like non-fiction books like autobiographies about sports people. I also like reading historical books about my favourite football team Everton!


What are you currently reading and why are you reading it?

Which genre is your favourite and why?



Which genre is your favourite and why?


I enjoy reading autobiographies; this allows me to find out more about a person and their life story.




What are you currently reading and why are you reading it?


What are you currently reading and why are you reading it?

What are you currently reading and why are you reading it?



What are you currently reading and why are you reading it?


I currently have 3 books on the go!



As a child, my favourite genre of book was fantasy-fiction with me spending most of my spare time being transported by the pages into the World of Hogwarts.


I also found myself engrossed in anything written by Jacqueline Wilson and would spend my pocket money buying the latest instalment of Tracey Beaker.


